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Land Acknowledgement

Before Saint Andrews, and still existing today, is Qonasqamkuk, the ancient place of the Peskotomuhkati. These lands are the ancestral and unceded territory of the Peskotomuhkati people and are covered by the “Treaties of Peace and Friendship” which Mi’kmaq, Wəlastəkwiyyik (Maliseet) and Peskotomuhkati Peoples first signed with the British Crown in 1726. The treaties did not deal with surrender of lands and resources but in fact recognized Indigenous title and established rules for what was to be an ongoing relationship of peace, friendship, and mutual respect between nations for two very different modes of life and land use. As recently as 2016, it was agreed by the Governments of Canada and New Brunswick and the Peskotomuhkati that the treaties would be reaffirmed. All settlers, including recent arrivals, are governed by these treaties; we are all treaty people. As such, we have a responsibility to consider what it means to acknowledge the history and legacy of colonialism, and to embrace our treaty responsibilities now and into the future.


